

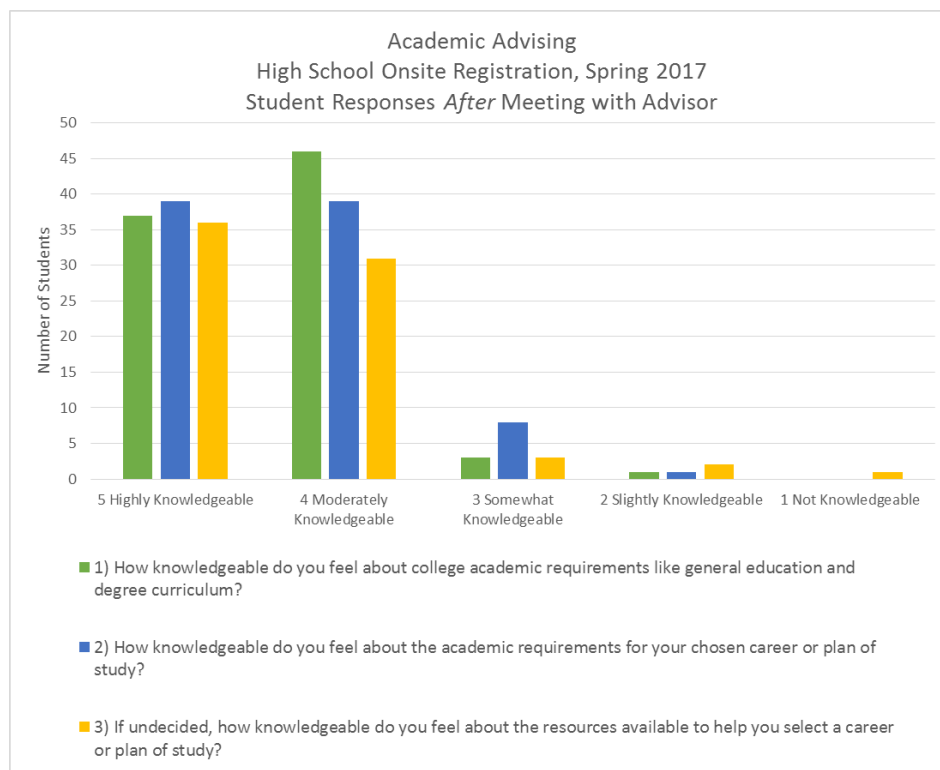
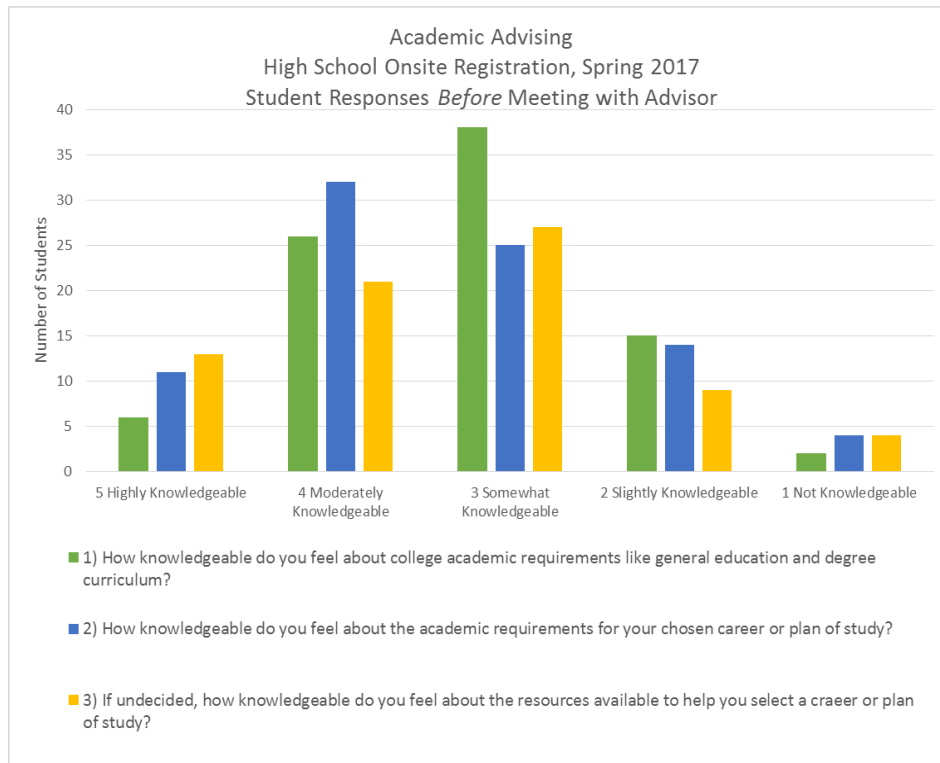

The form included surveys to gauge current high school students’ understanding of college academic requirements at their initial registration for SWIC classes. The purpose of this assessment was to compare new students’ knowledge of academic requirements before and after meeting with an advisor for the first time.</p> <p>1a. State the department SL goal(s) or core competency linked to this assessment.</p> <p>Goal 1: The student shall be able to identify program and degree options and how they correlate to career choice, and determine career and academic goals.</p> <p>1 b. Identify which students were assessed.</p> <p>The survey was administered to students at high school onsite registration appointments. These appointments are conducted in the Spring to facilitate registration of new students for the Summer and/or Fall terms.</p> <p>1c. What was the sample size of the group assessed/the number of possible students?</p> <p>87 students completed both sets of survey questions out of 108 students who were given intake forms.</p>	
2. Describe when and how the assessment was conducted/completed. (Attach the tool(s) that was used to collect performance measures.) <p>The survey was given to students who met with an academic advisor at high school onsite registration dates in Spring 2017. The following high schools participated: Cahokia High School (3/10/17), Columbia High School (3/27/17), Duplo Junior/Senior High School (3/20/17), Marissa Junior/Senior High School (4/3/17), Sparta High School (3/3/17), Steeleville High School (3/2/17), Triad High School (3/8/17), and Waterloo High School (3/23/17 and 4/6/17).</p>	

Intake forms were provided to each student immediately prior to their registration appointment. After the student completed the intake form, including the survey questions, they met with an advisor to select classes. After their registration appointment, the same form was provided to the same student again for completion of the follow-up survey questions at the bottom of the form.

Academic Advising set a goal that, after meeting with an advisor for the first time, 90% of students would feel highly knowledgeable (5) or moderately knowledgeable (4) about general education requirements, academic requirements for their chosen plan of study, and available resources to help them select a plan of study.

4a. What is the analysis/interpretation of these results/trend results?

Data from the intake and follow-up surveys administered at high school onsite registration appointments in Spring 2017 indicates that students felt significantly more knowledgeable about college academic requirements and related resources after meeting with an academic advisor for the first time. Of the 87 students who completed the follow-up survey, 95% felt highly or moderately knowledgeable about college academic requirements like general education and degree curriculum, 90% felt highly or moderately knowledgeable about the academic requirements for their chosen career or plan of study, and 92% felt highly or moderately knowledgeable about the resources available to help them select a career or plan of study. These results confirm the positive impact academic advisors have with students after just one session.

5. What changes, if any, does the department plan to implement to improve student performance? At high school onsite registration appointments, academic advisors meet with new and prospective students at their first step in their college career. At this stage, students have submitted new student information forms and have taken SWIC's placement test, or else earned qualifying ACT, SAT or PARCC scores. This is the first time that these students officially discuss degree and career plan, degree options, course selection, and transfer opportunities. These registration appointments are limited to thirty minutes and therefore do not afford much time to discuss or develop a detailed academic plan beyond the student's first semester.

Despite this limited time with students, data from the intake and follow-up surveys administered at high school onsite registration appointments in Spring 2017 indicates that students felt significantly more knowledgeable about college academic requirements and related resources after meeting with an academic advisor for the first time. Of the 87 students who completed the follow-up survey, 95% felt highly or moderately knowledgeable about college academic requirements like general education and degree curriculum, 90% felt highly or moderately knowledgeable about the academic requirements for their chosen career or plan of study, and 92% felt highly or moderately knowledgeable about the resources available to help them select a career or plan of study.

These results confirm the positive impact academic advisors have with students after just one session. More than 9 in 10 students surveyed felt knowledgeable about general degree requirements, their own specific degree requirements, and how to access resources to answer further questions. These students were encouraged to continue working with an academic advisor throughout their college career to develop their degree plan further.

The Academic Advising Department plans to continue providing quality service to new, current, visiting, and returning SWIC students. Academic advisors will undergo further training on administering future assessments to ensure consistent implementation in every session.
