EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

A bachelor's degree in early childhood education will provide a person with the skills and knowledge to work with children from birth to second grade. After completing a bachelor's degree and state licensure requirements, students can find employment as a Pre-K through second grade teacher, Preschool for All teacher, or special education teacher. Those pursuing the non-licensure route can find employment as early intervention providers, Head Start teacher, home visitor, prevention initiative teacher or ECE site director.
