ESL Reading Skills – This course is designed to improve reading skills for intermediate and advanced-level ESL students. The class helps students improve reading comprehension and speed, while developing vocabulary and basic academic skills.

ESL Transitional Reading – This course is for non-native English speakers who have completed or tested out of the ESL classes, and who are preparing to continue their education at the college level. The class focuses on reading comprehension, increasing reading fluency, and building vocabulary. A qualifying reading test score is required.

Registration and Testing: All new students wishing to enroll in our free classes are required to complete paperwork and take a written test to determine program eligibility and level. Our grant-funded classes are offered free to eligible students through Title II of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) as administered by the Illinois Community College Board. Students will be required to retest periodically to document their progress with English and to continue with classes.
