### Receipt of SNAP Benefits

**2021-2022 guidelines for who is considered to be a member of the household:**

**For independent students**, the student's household includes:

- The student.
- The student's spouse, if the student is married and not separated.
- The student's or spouse's children if the student or spouse will provide more than half of the children's support from July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022, even if the children do not live with the student.
- Other people **IF** they now live with the student **AND** the student or spouse provides more than half of the other people's support **AND** will continue to provide more than half of their support through June 30, 2022.

**For dependent students**, the parents' household includes:

- The student.
- The parents (including a stepparent), **following the FAFSA guidelines**, even if the student does not live with the parents.
- The parents' other children if the parents will provide more than half of the children's support from July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022, or if the other children would be required to provide parental information if they were completing a FAFSA for 2021–2022. Include children who meet either of these standards even if the children do not live with the parents.
- Other people **IF** they now live with the parents **AND** the parents provide more than half of the other people's support **AND** will continue to provide more than half of their support through June 30, 2022.
