PSOP will be closed on June 20 in observance of Juneteenth, Emancipation Day.

What is Juneteenth? On June 19, 1865, two and a half years after Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation on Jan. 1, 1863, Major General Gordon Granger and Union soldiers announced in Galveston, Texas that the war had ended and all Black Americans who were held in slavery were free. Juneteenth began as a celebration for freed Black Americans in Texas, but eventually grew to be a celebration for all freed Black Americans throughout the United States.

Why is Juneteenth important? Juneteenth marks a date of significance in American history and represents the ways in which freedom for Black people have been delayed. It is a reminder that "nobody is free until everybody is free". It should be celebrated as the day when all Americans were liberated and created equal. It should be a day to reflect, to learn, and to grow as a nation and as a people.

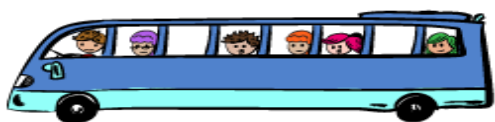
