

# Application Planning Guide for Practical Nursing Program (025C)

## Practical Nursing Planning Guide for Admission Summer 2025, Fall 2025 & Spring 2026:

**The intent of this guide is to help applicants develop a plan of readiness for this application period.**

Admission to the PN program is highly competitive. The program accepts approximately 20 applicants for summer, 24 applicants for fall and 35 applicants for spring from a pool of 150-200 individuals.

- ✓ Program Admission Required to enroll in PN courses
- ✓ Online application is available and may be submitted through your e-STORM Student Center during the following periods:
  - Summer 2025 admission: Jan. 31 – March 31, 2025
  - Fall 2025 admission: April 1 - June 1, 2025
  - Spring 2026 admission: June 2 - Aug. 1, 2025
- ✓ Deadlines for Application & ALL Supporting Documentation:
  - Summer 2025 admission (Red Bud Campus): March 31, 2025
  - Fall 2025 admission (East St. Louis Higher Education Center): June 1, 2025
  - Spring 2026 admission (Sam Wolf Granite City Campus): Aug. 1, 2025
- ✓ High School or college GPA MUST be on transcripts and received by enrollment services no later than deadlines above.
- ✓ Pre-Nursing Entrance Exam must be completed by the specified date listed on the application
- ✓ No waiting lists; application required each year

# **Overview of Requirements & Due Dates**

**Applicants must submit the following to the Enrollment Services Office by noted deadlines, unless the application period has been extended.**

- ✓ **Practical Nursing Application (due by March 31, 2025 for summer/June 1, 2025 for fall/Aug. 1, 2025 for spring)** Applications are available and must be submitted between Jan. 1, 2025 to March 31, 2025 for entry into the Summer 2025 semester; April 1, 2025 to June 1, 2025 for entry into the Fall 2025 semester; and June 2, 2025 to Aug. 1, 2025 for entry into the Spring 2026 semester. Applications are available for online submission in the eSTORM Student Center. Hard copies are available in the Enrollment Services office during the application period. Completed hard copies are submitted to the Enrollment Services Office.
- ✓ **Meet with an Academic Advisor** to determine placement. Student must be eligible for ENG 97 or completion of ENG 94 with a "C" or better and eligible for MATH 97 or completion of MATH 95 with a "C" or better.

- ✓ **Transcripts documenting High School or College GPA due by March 31, 2025 for summer, June 1, 2025 for fall and Aug. 1, 2025 for spring.**
  - ❖ College course grades supersede high school grade when both appear on official transcripts.
  - ❖ Most recent grades are used to determine points earned.
- ✓ **Transcripts from all colleges, universities, or approved/accredited Practical Nursing attended due by March 31, 2025 for summer, June 1, 2025 for fall and Aug. 1, 2025 for spring.**
  - ❖ To have college transcripts reviewed for possible transfer credit, log into [eSTORM](#) and select the Transfer Credit Evaluation link found in  dropdown under Academics in your Student Center.
  - ❖ Complete and submit this form as early as possible before the March 31<sup>st</sup> (Summer admission), June 1<sup>st</sup> (Fall admission) or Aug. 1<sup>st</sup> (Spring admission) deadlines to have the transcript reviewed for potential course credit.
- ✓ **Pre-Nursing Admission Exam**
  - ❖ A non-refundable \$70 testing fee is due by Application Deadline for corresponding cohort or the next business day to the Business Office.
  - ❖ After the test fee is paid, students will receive an email to their student.swic.edu account identifying the steps to schedule the exam. The exam must be scheduled and completed at the Belleville Campus Testing Center or the Granite City Campus between **March 1<sup>st</sup> - 31<sup>st</sup>** for RB summer application, **May 1<sup>st</sup> - June 1<sup>st</sup>** testing for ESTL Fall application, and **Sep 1 - 30<sup>th</sup>** testing for GC spring application.
  - ❖ If tested previously, scores are accepted if less than 3 years old and the same test is used. If applicants have taken the test more than once, the most recent score is used.

## **Section A – Semester Admission**

**Designate your entry semester:** (student must choose **one** option)

- Summer 2025 (Red Bud Campus)
- Fall 2025 (East St. Louis High Education Center)
- Spring 2026 (Sam Wolf Granite City Campus)

### **Program Locations**

#### **Summer Admission (2025)**

The Practical Nursing Program is offered at the Red Bud Campus for summer semester. Students can only choose one option per application. The PN program accepts approximately 20 students each summer semester.

#### **Fall Admission (2025)**

The Practical Nursing Program is offered at the East St. Louis Higher Education Center for fall semester. Students can only choose **one** option per application. The PN program accepts approximately 24 students each fall semester.

#### **Spring Admission (2026)**

The Practical Nursing Program is offered at the Sam Wolf Granite City Campus for spring semester. Students can only choose **one** option per application. The PN program accepts approximately 35 students each spring semester.

## Section B- Prerequisites to Application

**For Summer 2025 admission, it is MANDATORY to have High School GPA or College GPA Prerequisite on file by March 31, 2025 – unless the application period has been extended.**

**For Fall 2025 admission, it is MANDATORY to have High School GPA or College GPA Prerequisite on file by June 1, 2025 – unless the application period has been extended.**

**For Spring 2026 admission, it is MANDATORY to have High School GPA or College GPA Prerequisite on file by August 1, 2025 – unless the application period has been extended.**

### **How POINTS are assigned on the application to Prerequisite courses:**

1. Record the GPA for high school or college. College course grades supersede high school grade when both appear on official transcripts, if 12 or more college credit hours are received.
2. A minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 grading scale is required.
3. Courses must be on the transcript by March 31, 2025 for summer, June 1, 2025 for fall and Aug. 1, 2025 for spring deadline.

## **High School GPA or College GPA Prerequisite**

*Student must choose one of the requirements below:*

High School GPA of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 grading scale from an accredited high school OR

College GPA of 2.5 or higher if 12 or more college credit hours received.

\*\*\*College course grades supersede high school grade when both appear on official transcripts.

*Example of GPA Point Calculation: GPA 3.25 = 3.25 Received Points*

### **Suggestions for increasing points earned in Prerequisites Section:**

- The higher the GPA, the more points are generated on the application.
- Students with low GPA scores may consider retaking course to earn a higher GPA. **Students must have at least 12 college credits to use as a GPA option on the application.** Meet with an academic advisor to determine courses to improve GPA. ## Section D – Pre-Nursing Admission Exam

### It is MANDATORY to take the Pre-Nursing Admission Exam

Students earn points in this section based on results of the pre-nursing "TEAS" Admission examination available during the designated period assigned to each application. Directions on taking this exam are provided to students via their "swic.edu" email account after Enrollment Services Office receives your PN application and the Business Office receives the \$70 examination fee. This email will identify when & how to schedule a testing date to complete this computerized exam at the SWIC Belleville Campus Testing Center and Granite City testing center during identified dates. The examination fee is non-refundable. Study guides for the TEAS (6th edition) are available at the campus bookstore or online through the manufacturer.

**Students who have previously taken TEAS** at another testing site within 3 years of the deadline, will be advised to request their score be transferred to Enrollment Services at SWIC from ATI online at [www.atitesting.com](http://www.atitesting.com). ATI may charge a transcript fee to be paid by the student. Transfer scores from ATI TEAS must be received by **SWIC NO LATER THAN then deadline of the application.**

#### How POINTS are assigned on the application for the Pre-Nursing admission exam:

If you wish to use your 2022, 2023, or 2024 TEAS score, indicate score and year of testing and site exam was taken. If you took the exam more than once, the most recent score will be used. If you have not taken this exam, place "CE" under the score section and you can estimate the points you believe you will earn. **Students may only take the TEAS examination once during the current application period.**

**A final ranking score is determined by an academic evaluator, validating each submission and adding points earned in sections B + C + D = \_\_\_\_\_ 9.5 pts. Max**

Selection of qualified applicants will be based on a numerical ranking procedure.

Meeting the application deadlines is important in being successful in this process. ### **For Fall 2025 Admission:**

**Submit between April 1 - June 1, 2025:**

- Application on file for Fall 2025 admission
- GED verification (if applicable), High School and all College transcripts
- SWIC Course Placement Assessment score identifying you are eligible for enrolling in ENG 97 & MATH 97 or above
- Applicable CNA certification
- TEAS Test Transcripts from ATI, if applicable
- Completion of Pre-Nursing Admission Exam
- Proof of Residency
  - Out-of-District Students must provide Inter-district Cooperative/Career Agreement paperwork for “indistrict” status in this application process

### **For Spring 2026 Admission:**

**Submit between June 2 – Aug. 1, 2025:**

- Application on file for Spring 2026 admission
- GED verification (if applicable), High School and all College transcripts
- SWIC Course Placement Assessment score identifying you are eligible for enrolling in ENG 97 & MATH 97 or above
- Applicable CNA certification
- TEAS Test Transcripts from ATI, if applicable
- Completion of Pre-Nursing Admission Exam
- Proof of Residency
  - Out-of-District Students must provide Inter-district Cooperative/Career Agreement paperwork for “indistrict” status in this application process
